The following resolution was offered by Mr. Ford Resolved That a resolution passed by the Board of County Supervisors of this Douglas County on the 23^d day 1859. be hereby re-considered and that two thousand two hundred dollars in county order be issued to prepare foundations and side walls for jail as the work may progress under the certificate of the Architect which motion was lost.
