Board of County Supervisors met pursuant to the following call to wit

Dothe Clerk of the Board of Supervisors of Douglas County &c.

You are hereby requested to call a meeting of said board of Supervisors on Friday March 16<sup>th</sup> 1860 at one o'clock P.M. at the office of said Board

Present Messrs. Enos of Laurence township, Bruner of Keosauqua, Brown of Marion, Hindman of Willow Springs, Rogers of Eudora, Cole of Palmyra and Umberger of Clinton

and called J. Pratt Clerk  
Chairman being absent - on motion J. Bruner was elected Chairman pro tem

On motion of Mr. Umberger it was resolved that the districting for the County Commissioners be as follows 1<sup>st</sup> District Laurence Township, 2<sup>d</sup> District Keosauqua Clinton and Marion Township 3<sup>d</sup> District Willow Springs, Palmyra and Eudora

Ordered that an election precinct be and is hereby established at the Union School House in Laurence Township

The account of J. Pratt for services as Clerk of the Board of Supervisors from Jan'y 1, 1860 to April 1, 1860 was allowed at \$212.50

The account of S. Cole for making returns of election Dec 1859 (State officers) was allowed at \$3.32

The accounts of J. Bruner, D.G. Hindman, S. Cole, H.S. Enos, D.G. Brown, W. Umberger and Jens Rogers for services as Supervisors were allowed as follows
