The petition of Oliver Barber and others praying for a new township to be established was presented and upon consideration of said petition it appearing to the Board that the township asked for contains territory equal to at least thirty six square miles and at least three hundred inhabitants within the limits thereof and that the petition presented to the Board for such change is signed by at least fifty citizens resident in the proposed township and that the law has been complied with in all respects it is ordered that a township is hereby set off and organized with the following boundaries to wit beginning at the north east corner of Section twenty, Township twelve, Range nineteen, thence south to the south east corner of Section eight, Township thirteen Range nineteen; thence west to the south west corner of Section eleven township thirteen range fourteen; thence north to the north west corner of Section twenty three township twelve, range fourteen; thence east to the place of beginning; that the name of said township shall be Kanwaka; that the time of holding the first election in said township shall be on the 4th Monday in April A.D. 1860 at Kanwaka

Ordered that the following officers of said Township are hereby appointed

- Trustee Aaron C. Platt
 - Justice of the Peace for two years John A. Wakefield
 - Justice of the Peace for one year Aaron Woods
 - Constables Solomon and John Harding
- Heas and they on the above orders being called read as follows Heas Messrs Sampson and Woodard Nay ell Berkaw
