

The petition of W. G. Melville and others praying for a change in the boundaries of Eudora Township was presented and it appearing to the Board that the petitioners are bona fide residents of this County and that the law relating to change of boundaries of township lines has been complied with it was ordered that the portion of Palmyra township lying within the following boundaries be added to Eudora Township - beginning at the North west corner of Section two (2) Township fourteen (14) Range twenty (20) South to South west corner of Section eleven (11) Township fourteen (14) Range twenty (20) east to the South east corner of Section ten (10) Township fourteen (14) Range twenty one (21) thence north to North east corner of Section three (3) Township fourteen (14) range twenty one (21) thence west to the place of beginning

It was ordered that David G. Peabody County assessor be and is hereby authorized to appoint three deputies if he deems it necessary.

It was ordered that the Bridge at Eudora across the Wakarusa for which an appropriation of four hundred dollars was made on the 23<sup>d</sup> day of May 1879 for the completion of which funds were given by certain parties and which appropriation was paid to said parties be accepted by this Board

Ordered that a tax of two million the dollar, on the lands in Douglas County subject to taxation, is hereby assessed and levied for road purposes

The Bond of Saml. C. Steele as Trustee of Clinton Township with Wm. A. Selkegg and Wm. S. Hughes as securities was approved

The Bond of O. E. Carpenter as Constable of Palmyra Township with John Graham and Michael Blake as securities was approved

The Bond of Dr. Gleason as Trustee of Marion Township with David G. Peabody and Wm. Cleland as securities was approved

Bonds of Reuben B. Richards and J. H. Thompson as Constables of Clinton Township were rejected not being made in accordance with law

Bond of David G. Peabody as County assessor with Wm. Blackford and James M. Quinn as securities was approved

Bond of J. C. Briggs as Justice of the Peace with John H. Riatt and E. B. Johnson as securities was approved
