being satisfied that such proposed road is necessary
it is ordered that W. A. Dinsmore, Amiel Stoenes,
and McLeole be and are hereby appointed as
jurers and A. A. Woodhull as surveyor to view
said road and locate the same according
to law on the 21st day of July ad. 1860.

The Report of the Grand Jury, clay term, was
presented and read as follows:

We the undersigned Grand Jurors now in session
in and for Douglas County Territory of Kansas would
most respectfully report that upon our examination
of the jail facilities find they are entirely insecure
and unfit to be used as such hence in our opinion
we can with the strictest propriety and justice declare
the present jail a nuisance.

But upon further inquiry and examination find
that the said county has through their County
commissioners purchased the requisite material
for the construction of an iron jail which said
material is now in this city ready to be put up
and find it well calculated for all the purposes
designed as also having in connection with it
water pumps, pipes, iron bedsteads, &c &c

The great necessity for such a building for
the safe keeping of prisoners being so apparent
we would respectfully but most earnestly urge
upon the commissioners of this county the great
necessity of an immediate erection and com-
pletion of said iron jail.

We further would further recommend for the con-
sideration of the County commissioners that they
personally examine and enquire into the condition
of all the bridges within the boundaries of this
County and wherever in their opinion there is any
necessity for attention or repair for the more per-
fect safety in crossing and recrossing that they
take the necessary steps for their immediate
reconstruction or repair.
