

represent that in their opinion a road ought to be made beginning at some point on the river bottom road west of Mr. D. Brandon and running thence southerly to Doct. J. Barker's dwelling house thence bearing west of south to the middle road as it is called so as to intersect the same at or near the top of the first hill east of Mr. Muzzys dwelling house

In connection with the above road we would also recommend an alteration in the middle road as follows:

Beginning under or at the foot of the hill east of Mr. Muzzys then curving northerly on the north side of the ravine so as to avoid the wet ground then intersect the new road north of the intersection of the two roads at the top of the hill mentioned above We would also represent that a road ought to be made beginning at the section corner on the Reeder float near the school house & running thence westerly to the east end of J. W. Daylors lane thence in and along the lane to the west end thereof thence up the hill on the north side of the ravine to or near the present track of travel to the top of the hill: thence west across the prairie so as to intersect the first road described above south of Doct. J. Barker's dwelling house

In connection with this road we would also recommend the removal of such part of the river bottom road as lies south of the above mentioned section corner on the Reeder float instead thereof to lay out a road beginning at the first quarter stake east of said section corner and running thence south on the quarter line so as to intersect the above mentioned middle road at the south east corner of Doct. J. Doy's claim
