We the undersigned commissioners appointed by your honorable body to view a road in regard to a proposed change between the bridge at the crossing of the Wakarusa and the intersection of the territorial road from Lawrence to Emporia with the east line of the town of Chilton as more fully set forth in the petition of Mrs. Jesse and others met on the morning of the 13th inst agreeably to notice with D. G. Peabody the Surveyor and after being first duly sworn proceeded to view said road and the proposed alteration and after a full and careful examination of the same we leave to report adversely to the proposed alteration as set forth in said petition.
