

petition has been given and the petitioners entering into bonds with sufficient securities according to law to the satisfaction of the Board and the petition being read in open meeting of the Board and the Board being satisfied that such proposed change is necessary it is ordered that Asher Smith, John H. Birman and M. K. Kellogg be and are hereby appointed as jurors and D. G. Peabody as Surveyor to view the route proposed to be changed and establish the same according to law on the 15th October, 1860

The Board proceeded to estimate and determine the amount of money to be raised by tax for county purposes - for the support of common schools and for the payment of the Bonds and interest of the County (falling due during the present year,) for the current year, and it was ordered that there be levied and collected for said purposes from the several persons and property subject to taxation in this county as returned by the assessor as follows

For General purposes	5 mills on each dollar of property
School	1 " " " " " "
Sinking fund for payment of Bonds & Interest	3 " " " " " "

A note held by Josiah Miller signed by Josiah Miller President, Henry Barneklow, M. A. Davis Co. Com. for \$500. with interest from Jan. 16, 1858 at 5% per month was presented and it was ordered that said note be allowed and that order for the payment of the same to the amount of \$1263.33 be drawn

A note held by assignees of Geo. Ford, signed by Josiah Miller, Henry Barneklow for \$109.34 was with interest from Feb. 22, 1858 at 5% per month was presented and it was ordered that said note be allowed and that order for the payment of the same to the amount of \$280.64 be drawn

It was ordered that said amounts of 1263.33 and \$280.64 for said notes be paid over when all bills on their account are withdrawn and cashed

On motion it was voted that the Bridge known as Bone's bridge, on the Wakarusa be accepted by this Board

Ordered that the sum of 100 be appropriated toward defraying the expenses of repairing the following bridges in this County to-wit: Bridge at Captains Creek
