The Justice of Wakarusa Township being before the Board and requesting that the tax levied on said township for township purposes be changed from \$250 to \$10 mills on the dollar of the taxable property of the township it was ordered that said change be made and that the tax as aforesaid be and is hereby fixed at \$10 mills on the dollar of taxable property in said township as returned by the assessors for the year 1860-1861.

The petition of Andrew White and others praying for a county road as follows: viz "Beginning at the north east corner of the town of Bloomington from thence east on the section line or as near as practicable between the sections 21 18 & 19 - 17 & 20 so continuing on said line crossing the Marion and Lawrence road till it intersects the Minnecola Lawrence road and there to terminate being presented and the Board being satisfied that proper notice of the presentation of said petition has been given, and the petitioners entering into bonds with sufficient securities according to law to the satisfaction of the Board and the petition being read in open meeting of the Board and the Board being satisfied that such proposed road is necessary it is ordered that John H. Gorman J^m A. Belkregg and Chas. Dickson be appointed as commissioners and Chas. Dickson as surveyor to view said proposed road according to law on the 22^d day of October A.D. 1860.
