Resolved That bills against Douglas County for services in criminal cases before Justices of the Peace shall not be considered by the Co. Board unless they show upon the face by a certificate of the Justice

1st The nature of the charge whether a felony or misdemeanor

2^d That the costs were adjudged against defendant and execution having been issued against the defendant was returned no property found after diligent effort

3^d That if the charge was a felony the defendant was discharged

4th That if the charge was a misdemeanor and the defendant was acquitted that there was no probable cause of action and that the costs were adjudged against the prosecutor and that execution having been issued against the prosecutor was returned no property found after diligent effort

5th That if the charge was a misdemeanor and the defendant was acquitted that there was a probable cause of action and that the costs are adjudged against the County

6th That said claims have been duly sworn to by all the parties claiming

Resolved That the Governor Secretary members of the Legislative Assembly and Judges of the Supreme Court of the Territory of Kansas be respectfully invited to visit and inspect the County Jail of Douglas City
