Ordered by the Board that the County Clerk make out all bills quarterly, chargeable to other parties, for boarding and medical attendance of prisoners and present the same to County Treasurer for collection.

Resolved that all money received from the United States for boarding and medical attendance of prisoners be placed to the credit of the contingent fund.

Resolved that Turner-Sampson be allowed Fifty Dollars for services as Chairman of County Commissioners and acting as agent in furnishing Printing, Books, &c. up to this date.
