The 5th " Ordinance, That all money, for fines, and for Licenses, and from all other sources not otherwise appropriated, that have been or may hereafter be paid into the County Treasury be appropriated to the Contingent Fund. And that the County Clerk notify the County Treasurer of the passage of the above Resolution.

The 6th " to Shunklin's Bill for Stationery for District Clerk's Office for Quarter ending July 1st 1862- accented at \$1.15

The 7th " R. Morrow's Bill, for Rent of Court House Quarter Ending June 1st accented at \$150.00
