

Lawrence Monday October 6th 1862

The Board of County Commissioners met pursuant to law
 Fortunatus Gleason Chairman, John E. Campbell and
 Chas. Dickson present

Geo W Reynolds made application
 for the abatement of tax for the year 1861 on his personal property.
 On motion the consideration of the matter was postponed untill
 next Friday

S. F. Carson and others presented a Petition for a
 County Road. A Bond was filed and affidavit made as to
 the publication of the proper Notice of the Road, upon consideration
 of which the Board determined to appoint Viewers and accord-
 ingly Thomas Banks, Daniel Wright of Marion Township
 and Chas W Single of Willow Springs Township appointed Viewers &
 David Hubbard the County Surveyor appointed Surveyor of the
 Road and were ordered to meet on Wednesday the 26th day of
 October 1862 at 11 o'clock A.M. at the house of S. F. Carson

On motion the Board adjourned untill next week P.M.

The Board of County Commissioners met pursuant to adjour-
 nment S. Gleason Chairman, Chas. Dickson and John Campbell
 present

The Board took into consideration the question of appropriate-
 ing \$500⁰⁰ for the Douglas County Agricultural Society after much
 consideration of the law, assisted by the District Attorney
 C. S. Eocorum and Justice Wilder and Hor Stiel President of the
 Society, a motion was made by Mr Chas. Dickson that we reject
 the application for an Appropriation, which was carried.

The Board took into consideration the business of levying a tax
 to pay the Territorial tax of 1859 and 1860 and determined
 that they would postpone the matter untill the January meeting
 of the Board.

On motion the following Resolution was
 passed to wit:

To the Legal Voters of Douglas County

In accordance with the Statutes in such cases made and
 provided, we the undersigned County Commissioners of Douglas
 Kansas do hereby submit to the Legal Voters of said County to be
 voted upon them at the General Election to be held on the 14th day
 of November 4th 1862 the following proposition to wit: Shall
 the Board of County Commissioners be authorized to issue Bonds
 of the County to the amount of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) or so much
 thereof as may be necessary to make a sum sufficient to liquidate the
 outstanding County Orders of the County, bearing 8 percent per annum
 Those voting for the Proposition shall have upon their Ballots the
