On motion J. Gleason Chairman of the Board and Geo W Bell County Clerk were appointed a committee to make a List of the County Orders redeemed by the County Treasurer.

Which committee presented the following Report to wit:-

To the Honorable Board of County Commissioners, We the undersigned Joint Committee J. Gleason, and Geo W Bell appointed to audit the Accounts of A. Elliott County Treasurer of the last Fiscal Year respectfully represent that the said Treasurer redeemed,

County Bonds	4,600.00
Coupons	2,215.00
Amounting to the sum of	\$ 15,202.16

all of which Orders Bonds and Coupons were cancelled upon the Order Book of the County Clerk's Office and destroyed in the presence of your Committee James C. Norton, S. F. Curran, John C. Campbell Oct 10th and 14th 1862

The Board accepted the above Report and ordered it placed on the minutes of the Board as a part of their proceedings

On motion the Board adjourned until Monday Morning the 13th day of October 1862 9 o'clock A.M. Geo W Bell County Clerk

The Board of County Commissioners met pursuant to adjournment Present J. Gleason, Chairman, Chas. Jackson and John C. Campbell

The first thing in order was the statement of tax on the personal Property of Geo W Reynolds. The Chairman proceeded to ask the following Questions of the said Geo W Reynolds under oath

1st What amount was due you from all sources at the time of his assessment of 1861, including Orders, Mortgages, and Moneys or what amount of personal property did you possess at this time
 Answer about \$3000.00

2nd Question What was the amount of your indebtedness at the time of the assessment.

Answer about \$2500.00
 Questions did the Treasurer demand a List of your property. Answer Yes he did but I could not make a list in a minute and he then took out his paper and made the assessment. The following is the Oath administered to Mr Reynolds. Sworn since October 13th 1862

Geo W Reynolds upon Oath says that the amount of personal property assessed to him for the Year 1861 by A. C. Grant Deputy County Assessor was \$1820.00 more than he possessed over and above his debts, and respectfully prays to him the said
