Sauvage Wednesday July 8<sup>th</sup> 1863 8 o'clock A.M.

The Board of County Commissioners met pursuant to adjournment present Dr. Gleason Chairman, Chas. Jackson and John C. Campbell Commissioners, and Geo. W. Bell County Clerk.

The Board took up the Bill of J. Spear for printing Tax List of 1862 and audited the same at \$175.<sup>00</sup>/<sub>100</sub>

The Road Petition of Wm. E. Barnes and others was presented and accepted, and Messrs James Chapman, John Scott and Joshua Clark appointed viewers, and instructed to meet at the house of Wm. E. Barnes on Monday July 27<sup>th</sup> next A.M. for the purpose of viewing and locating said road, and Heald and Wheeler appointed Surveyor of said road to meet at the same time and place.

Road Petition of John V. Crane and others for the Change in the location of the Sauvage and Paola Road was presented and accepted, and the County Commissioners resolved themselves into a Committee to make the Change in the location of said road petitioned for by said John V. Crane and others. Said Commissioners decided to meet at the Post Store of John V. Crane in the City of Sauvage on the 11<sup>th</sup> day of August 1863 at 9 o'clock A.M.

John V. Crane Township Trustee of Mackinac Township submitted his resignation of the said Office which was accepted.

Chas. Jackson and others presented a petition for the appointment of Samuel Rapin to fill the vacancy in the Office of
