Board of Commissioners met pursuant to adjournment
 Present Commissioners Dickson and Baricklow
 and Paul R Brooks County Clerk-

On motion ordered that the
 Road petitioned for in Wakanusa Township by Joel Groves
 and others be established in part according to the report
 of the Viewers and Surveyor Filed in the Office of County
 Clerk July 5th 1864 and recorded in road Books

The County
 Clerk reported to the Board that he had licensed John
 Aik and Jacob Pfeiffer to keep a Ferry at or near the mouth
 of the Wakarusa River, to run across the Kansas river, amount
 of license \$15.00 Rates of Toll as follows One or two horses
 vehicle .30cts- Each additional pair of horses or yoke of
 cattle 15cts- Horse and rider 15cts led or drove stock 10cts
 Hogs and sheep each .05cts Footmen each .05cts- On motion
 ordered that the Bond be approved and the license
 continued one year from its date-
