E. Disbrow presented a petition asking for the review of a road commencing at the N.W. corner of the N.E. quarter of Section 18, Town 13, Range 18 running South to the S.W. corner of said Quarter Section thence South as near as practicable to the N.W. corner of the N.E. Quarter of Section 31 Township 13 Range 18.

It appearing that the course of said road had become uncertain on account of the field notes having been burned It was ordered that R. Scowton John McLaughlin and James Teggart be appointed to review said road and that the time and place of meeting for that purpose shall be at the house of E. Disbrow on the 17th day of January 1865 at 10 o'clock A.M.

C. C. Emery presented a petition asking for an abatement of a portion of District school Tax charged to him on the N.W. Quarter of Sec 29 T. 12, R. 19 and it appearing to the Board that an excess of \$7.20 had been returned and placed on the roll through error it was ordered that said amount be abated and charged to School Dist No 20. A similar petition from O. Patten was presented and it appearing that the sum of \$3.80 had been returned from Dist No 20 and placed on the rolls in excess of the amount legally due it was ordered that said sum be abated and the amount charged to said Dist No 20.
