Board met pursuant to adjournment Present full Board.

A petition was presented signed by S. Weaver asking that certain Streets and alleys in the City of Leecompton be vacated. On Motion ordered that Moses McCall William Glawn and John Hornback be appointed to examine said Streets and Alleys and report to the Board at its next meeting whether in their opinion any injustice or inconvenience would be worked by the vacating of said Lots.

John Nix presented a petition asking for a renewal of his Ferry licence, on Motion ordered that the licence of John Nix be renewed for one year from the 11th day of August 1865. It was further ordered that the amount of licence be fixed at \$5.00 and that the rates of ferryage remain as fixed last year.

A petition was presented signed by S. Weaver asking that a part of the Town of Leecompton be vacated as a Town site, On Motion ordered that the 5th day of July be set as the time when the Board will take testimony in regard to the occupancy of said Lots as set forth in the petition.

A petition was presented signed by S. W. Metekew and sixteen others asking that a road be established commencing at the N.E. corner of the N.W. Quarter of Sec. 2 Town 14, Range 18, via the S.E. corner of the S.E. quarter of Sec. 14 Town 14 Range 18 terminating at the N.E. corner of the N.E. quarter of Sec. 26, Town 14, Range 18. The Board being satisfied that proper publication had been made it was ordered that Redford Ruston, E. H. Vanhosen and J. M. Keall be appointed to view said proposed road, to meet at the house of S. W. Metekew on the 27th day of April 1865 at ten o'clock A.M.

A petition was presented signed by Oscar Burroughs and 57 others asking for an appropriation to improve the Baldwin City Black Jack and Ossawatimie Road in the Wakarusa Bottoms, said over.

The report of the Reviewers of a certain Road in Clinton Township the points of which had become uncertain on account of records being destroyed, was taken up and on Motion ordered that said road be established according to said reviewers report filed in the County Clerk's office March 14 1865.

The accounts of Henry Webber Trustee of Marion Township, J. L. Jones Trustee of Hammar Township, E. H. Vanhosen Trustee of Willow Springs Township, A. Curtis Trustee of Clinton Township, A. W. Webster Trustee of Palmyra Township, for services as Trustees were examined and approved.
