

Completed and in full operation from Lawrence to the Eastern boundary of Douglas County: Provided, that no greater amount of bonds shall be issued than the amount of stock owned by said Company in the County of Douglas. Yes, or No.

Ordered that the Clerk be instructed to change the public notice of said election to correspond with the foregoing amendments and cause the same to be published in the Lawrence Tribune and State Journal and Baldwin City Observer.

On motion Ordered that a Committee of three be appointed consisting of Messrs. Weaver and Jackson and Paul R. Brooks to meet at the Clerk's office on the 20th day of September for the purpose of receiving and canvassing the bonds, coupons and County orders which the County Treasurer may wish to surrender so also to receive and examine the Treasurer's report and vouchers up to July 1st 1885.

A petition was presented signed by C. A. Peace and others asking that the road commencing on the County line running West from the City of Lawrence and intersecting the road running from Leocompton to Birmingham be renewed and re-established. The field notes of said road having been destroyed and the points of the road become uncertain it was on motion Ordered that J. H. Groves, C. A. Peace and E. R. Hilder be appointed to meet with the County surveyor at the Headquarters of Hilder and Paton on the 24th day of August to review and if considered necessary straighten said road.

On motion Ordered that the sum of Fifteen Hundred Dollars be appropriated for the purpose of ditching the road across the Miamia bottom known as Weaver's Cropping road, payable to the Trustees of Miamia Township: and to be drawn payable on the 15th day of December 1885.

Bill of P. R. Brooks, County Clerk for mailing road tax roll and copying Tax sale record &c. was presented and allowed
Amount \$296.80
