

the Poor, and that said Committee be instructed to advertise for proposals for building said house and that the Committee be empowered and instructed to contract for the building and completion of said house at as early day as practicable;

On Motion it was ordered that Messrs Campbell and Nace and the County Surveyor be appointed a committee to select and stake out the site for buildings on the County farms.

Several proposals were received for superintending the County Poor farm & Asylum. After Examination of the several propositions it was ordered that the proposal of John E. Campbell be accepted and that he be appointed Superintendent of the County Asylum for the Poor at a salary of Twelve Hundred Dollars per year for himself and family to commence on the first day of March 1866.

On Motion ordered that Messrs Nace and Campbell be appointed a Committee to purchase such stock for the Poor farm as shall be necessary in their judgement to commence farming operations before the April meeting of the board.

Ordered that the County Superintendent of the Asylum for the poor be instructed to procure at the cost of the County such farming utensils as he shall consider necessary and for the best interests of the County for the Poor farm.
