

Wednesday Sept 5 1866 9 O'clock A.M.

The Board met pursuant to adjournment. Full board and clerk present.

A petition was presented and read signed by G. W. Godwin and 21 others asking that a road be located and established at certain points named therein. The commissioners being satisfied that legal publication had been made of the petition it was ordered that Forrest H. Hill, Richard Miller and G. C. Brackett be appointed to view said proposed road to meet at the house of G. W. Godwin in Clinton Township on the 4th day of October A.D. 1866 at ten O'clock A.M.

A petition was presented signed by John Williams and others asking that a road be established at certain points named therein and it appearing to the board that the notice of said petition and publication had been legally made it was ordered that Joseph Savage, C. Longfellow and William Cutchfield be appointed to view the route of said proposed road to meet at the house of J. W. Williams on the 18th day of October 1866 at 10 O'clock A.M.

A petition was presented signed by John W. Williams and others asking that a certain road be revived the points of which had become uncertain on account of the destruction of the field notes. On motion Joseph Savage, C. Longfellow and W. Cutchfield were appointed to revive the route of said road to meet at the house of J. W. Williams on the 18th day of October 1866.

A petition was presented signed by John Fry and fifteen others asking that a road be established at certain points named therein. Also a petition signed by H. L. Enos and others asking that a certain road be vacated and it appearing to the Board that legal publication had been made of said petitions it was ordered that G. W. Goss, R. L. Williams and O. A. Hainscow be appointed to view the route of said proposed road and also to view the road proposed to be vacated to meet at the house of John Gilmore on the 24th day of October A.D. 1866. at ten O'clock A.M.

A certified copy of the report of the Grand Jury on the Condition of the County Jail made to the District Court at the May term 1866 was read and ordered to be placed on file.

C. B. Buks presented his resignation as Constable for the Township of Palmyra which was on motion accepted.

On motion Ordered that the tax on personal property assessed to Merrill & Co in the City of Lawrence for the year 1866 be abated to the amount of \$98.55

Fred. Mubow presented his resignation as Constable of Endora Township which was accepted.

On motion O. G. Richards was appointed Constable in and for Endora Township to fill
