The Board met pursuant to adjournment. Full Board and Clerk present.

The report of viewers appointed to view the route of a road petitioned for by J. E. Brown and others was presented and read. The report was on motion adopted and the road established in accordance with the field notes and plat accompanying the report.

E. H. Adams claimed \$700 damages which on motion was disallowed.

The report of the viewers appointed to view the route of a road petitioned for by S. W. Holligoss and others was read. And on motion the report was rejected on account of illegality of the action of the viewers.

The Clerk presented County Warrants to the amount of \$449.90 which had remained unclaimed for a period of three years. The board proceeded to cancel the same and destroyed them as required by law.

On motion the board reconsidered their action appointing J. H. Kelley and John Young
