

The consideration of bids for superintending the County Asylum was resumed.

On Motion of Mr. Haze R. F. Barber's bid was accepted and he was appointed Superintendent for one year from the first day of March 1867.

The County Treasurer presented his report of receipts and expenditures disbursements from July 12 1865 to July 30 1866. On Motion the report was referred back for a detailed Statement of Tax Certificates on hand, at the date of the report and any other assets of the County in his possession and further that he be requested to include in his report the receipts and disbursements up to January 1867 and further that he be requested to present said report at the April Meeting.

The following resolution was offered and adopted

Whereas the Board did on the 15th day of January A.D. 1867 sell to Messrs Durall Green and others the tax certificates of Lots in Prairie City held by the County were on the 27th August 1863 destroyed by fire therefore resolved that the Clerk be authorized to issue tax deeds on such of said Lots as have been bid in by the County and on which tax deeds are due upon the certificate of the County Treasurer that such Lots are held by the County and that the certificates were destroyed as aforesaid.

On Motion F. Gleason Chairman and Paul R. Brooks Clerk of the Board were appointed a Committee to receive from the County Treasurer such County Orders and Bonds as he may wish to turn over to the Board at their April Meeting.
