On motion it was ordered that the fourth Monday of March 1867 be set for the election of officers in the new Township of Grant.

A communication was received from the City Council of the City of Lawrence in regard to the bill presented for boarding City prisoners asking that the Board present a new bill at a reduced price per day.

On motion the Clerk was instructed to make out a new bill at the rate of seventy five cents per day and present the same to the Council.

Lawrence Kansas March 18th 1867

Pursuant to an act of the Legislature of the State of Kansas Entitled "an act to provide for the Registration of voters" approved February 26th 1867 requiring the Board of County Commissioners to meet on the third Monday of March as a Board for the correction registration. The Board met but no quorum appearing the Board adjourned until tomorrow morning at nine o'clock.

Thursday March 19 1867

Board met pursuant to adjournment. Present Commissioners H. Gleason Chairman W. H. Hare and Geo. Cutler and proceeded to correct and revise the lists of the names of persons legally qualified to vote as returned by the several Boards of Registration.

H. S. Evans presented a bill for seed wheat furnished for Co. Ayghum amounting to \$67.98 which on motion was allowed.

The Board adjourned until tomorrow morning at 9 o'clock.

Wednesday March 20 1867

Board met pursuant to adjournment and proceeded to correct revise and complete the lists of persons legally qualified to vote.
