

been made it was ordered that G. W. Ross, Joseph Savage and S. W. Babcock be appointed to meet at the Wind Mill of Childs and Palm on the 13th day of June A.D. 1867 to view the route of said road as required by law.

J. J. Jones presented a petition to the Board asking for a license to keep a ferry across the Kansas river at the town of Eudora. On motion it was ordered that license be granted said Jones upon his filing a bond as required by law and paying into the County Treasury the sum of \$15. the rate of toll to remain as last established.

A petition was presented signed by William McKinney asking that a license be granted him to keep a ferry across the Kansas river at Leecompton. On motion ordered that a license be granted to said McKinney upon his paying into the County Treasury the sum of \$15. and filing a bond as the law directs.

The annual reports of the Trustees of Leecompton, Marion and Willow Springs townships were examined and approved and the bills of Robt Young Trustee of Leecompton Henry Webber Trustee of Marion and E. H. Vanhook Trustee of Willow Springs for services as Trustee were also approved.

The report of the Commissioners appointed to locate a state road from Black Jack via Eudora to Leavenworth and Lawrence road was presented read and on motion the report was accepted and the portion in Douglas County ordered to be opened as required by law.

On motion the sum of 24¢ was abated from the tax of C. W. Seamer for the year 1864 the same having been charged as road tax on personal property. The final report of John E. Campbell Superintendent of Co Asylum was presented read and accepted.

A proposition in writing was presented to the Board by James C. Steele offering to pay seventy five cents per lot for all the certificates held by the County ^{on lots in the town of Bloomington} on all the sales of said lots for taxes prior to 1866 he further agreeing to bid off the lots at the sale to be held in May 1867 and also guaranteeing that the taxes shall be paid for the next three years. On motion the proposition was accepted.

On motion the Board adjourned until tomorrow morning at nine o'clock.
