Charles Longfellow presented an appeal from the decision of the County Superintendent of Public instructions. In the matter of detaching the East half of Sections 12 and 13 from 13 Range 19 from District number 55 and attaching the same to District No 6. On motion it was ordered that the appeal be filed and the first Monday in September set as the day to hear and decide upon said appeal.

Robert Young Treasurer of Poor in LeCompton Township presented his report of expenditures for the year ending July 18 1867 on motion the report was accepted.

A proposition was presented to the Board signed by L. S. Stule and F. B. Foster offering to purchase the tax certificates held by the County on all lots in the town of Clinton West of J Street at the rate of seventy five cents per lot.

On motion ordered that the Treasurer be authorized to transfer the certificates of all lots west of J Street in the town of Clinton held by the County whenever said Stule & Foster shall pay into the treasurer the sum of 75¢ per lot and shall furnish a guarantee that the taxes on all said lots shall be paid before sale for three years.

E. Warner presented a petition asking that the interest on a certain tax certificate be refunded, on motion the petition was rejected.

On motion the Treasurer was authorized to transfer to Norman C. Blood all tax certificates of sale held by the County on all lots in the following named blocks in the town of Palmyra to wit: Blocks one to forty eight (48) inclusive upon the said Norman Blood paying in to the County Treasurer the sum of - One dollar and fifty cents per lot on which the County holds any certificates.

The report of the viewers on the road petition of R. B. Tasker and others was taken up and read on motion the road was adopted and established in accordance with the Field Notes and plat accompanying viewers report.

J. Trapp claim for damages to the amount of One thousand Dollars disallowed.
