The Board of Commissioners met pursuant to adjournment Present Commissioners Gleason Nace and Cutter and the County Clerk.

The report of the viewers appointed on the petition of H. Town and others was taken up, a remonstrance signed by J. H. Kelley and others was presented and read after a full hearing of the case the report of the viewers, which recommended that the road be established was rejected and the case dismissed.

A petition was presented and read signed by L. J. Chastain and a legal number of petitioners asking that a road be established at certain points named therein, with proof of legal notice and publication. On motion it was ordered that Abel Yates G. H. Godwin and John H. Furman be appointed viewers of the proposed road and it was further ordered that said viewers meet with the County Surveyor at the house of L. J. Chastain on the 6th day of February 1868 at ten o'clock A.M. and view said road and cause the same to be surveyed as required by law.

On motion the sum of Five Hundred Dollars was appropriated for building a bridge across Mud Creek on the Deacons Middle Road in addition to what has heretofore been appropriated for said bridge.

A petition was presented and read signed by Thomas M. Pearson and a legal number of petitioners asking that a road be established at certain points named therein with proof of legal notice and publication. On motion it was ordered that F. Hill A. R. Leonard and Jesse Vincent be appointed viewers of the route of said proposed road - and it was further ordered that said viewers and the County Surveyor
