The report of the viewers appointed at the April session of the Board on the petition of S. A. Stonebrakers and others having filed their report in the clerk's office it was presented and read. And on motion the consideration of the report was postponed until the October session of the board.

The report of the viewers appointed at the April session of the board 1868 on the petition of William Altenbreud and others having been filed in the clerk's office July 1 1868 was taken up and read and no legal objections being made thereto and the report being favorable to the establishment of the road it was on motion ordered that the report, plat and survey be recorded and that the clerk issue the order of the board to the proper surveyor of roads to cause said road to be opened for public travel.

The report of the viewers appointed at the April session of the Board 1868 on the petition of Nicholas Weil and others having been filed in the clerk's office was taken up and read. No legal objections being made thereto and being favorable to the establishment of the road it was on motion ordered that the report, plat and survey be recorded and that the order of the Board be issued to the proper surveyor of roads to cause said road to be opened for public travel.

The report of the viewers appointed April 6 1868 on the petition of J. W. Stewart and others having been filed in the clerk's office it was presented and read and on motion laid over until the October session of the Board.

The report of viewers appointed April 9 1869 on the petition of Thomas D. Wells and others having been filed in the clerk's office was presented and read and on motion laid over until the October session of the board.
