

Lawrence Kansas July 16 1868

The Board of Commissioners of Douglas County, met pursuant to adjournment

There were present Commissioners Luther Griffith and Platts and Paul R. Brooks County Clerk.

On motion of Mr Griffith it was ordered that the clerk be directed to deliver no County Orders to Stephen Ogden which have been or may be issued to him until he makes a satisfactory settlement with the Board of all matters connected with County business.

Simpson presented an application setting forth that the taxes on Lots 11 Connecticut Street and 25 Levee were paid in full up to November 1862 that the Treasurer had failed to mark the taxes as paid on said lots and that the same had been sold for taxes and tax deeds issued and asking the board to refund to the purchasers of the tax title the amount required by law and have said deeds cancelled. And it appearing to the satisfaction of the board that the facts were correctly set forth in said Application It was ordered that the County Treasurer be requested to tender to any person holding tax deeds on said lots issued for the taxes of any year prior to November 1862 the amount as required by section 131 in Article 16 of an Act to provide for the assessment and collection of taxes Approved Feb. 27 1868 and that said deeds be cancelled.

A petition was presented signed by H. L. Enos and others asking that a road be established at certain points named therein and it appearing to the satisfaction of the board that legal notice and publication had been made and security for costs in case the road shall not be established given it was ordered that C. W. Smith Jr. O. A. Hanscom and Thomas McFarland be appointed viewers and Holland Wheeler Surveyor and that said viewers and Surveyor meet on the 30th day of September A.D. 1868 at the house of C. O. Still and view, locate and survey said proposed road as petitioned for in the manner prescribed by law.

Mr Griffith offered the following resolution which was read and adopted.

Resolved that Col. W. F. Roberts Jr. Gleason Esq and Paul R. Brooks be and they are hereby appointed a committee to make final settlement with James Blood as Treasurer and make a full and complete report to the board in writing on or before the first Monday in September next of all moneys collected and paid out and on hand of the various funds charged to him by law for collection and the Treasurer is hereby instructed to forthwith turn over to said Committee all books and papers of his office necessary to a full understanding of all financial affairs of the County.

L. F. Jackson presented an application accompanied by affidavit setting forth that he had been erroneously assessed with personal property to the amount of \$1200. for the year 1867 and
