The petitioners having made application for the establishment of a County road as follows. Beginning at the Southern terminus of the road now travelled between the land owned and occupied by J. M. Hendry and G. B. Griffith on the East, and by W. A. Simpson and S. M. Simpson on the West in Wakarusa Township thence due South to the North line of the S.E. 1/4 of Section 7 thence East as near as practicable to the Section line between Sections 7 and 8 thence South to the S.E. corner of Section 18. all in Township 13 Range 20 W. A. Simpson one of the petitioners having filed his bond conditioned for the payment of all costs and expenses accruing on said application in case the prayer of the petition be not granted and which bond is accepted and approved, and it appearing that said petition is signed by at least twelve householders of Douglas County and that notice of the presentation of the petition has been given according to law it is ordered that D. G. Haskell, Turner Sampson and A. G. Brooks be and are hereby appointed Viewers and Holland Wheeler Surveyor of said road and that they meet at or near the residence of W. A. Simpson on the 27th day of February 1869 at ten o'clock a.m. and after being duly sworn proceed to the discharge of the duties of their several appointments. It was further ordered that the County Clerk issue in the name of the Board the necessary Order to said Viewers and Surveyor.
