

for land should not be allowed the said claim and award is not allowed, and no legal objections being made and the Board being of opinion that said road as revised and surveyed will be of public utility it is ordered that the report of said reviser with the survey and plat of said road be recorded and that said road be established fifty feet in width, it is further ordered that the County Clerk issue an order in the name of the Board directing the proper Overseers of roads to cause said road to be opened according to law.

A. G. Norman Trustee of Grant Township presented his report as Trustee of said Township for the past year which was examined and approved, A. G. Norman also presented his account of receipts and disbursements as Overseer of poor of Grant Township for the year ending April 1st 1869 which was examined and approved.

On motion the Board adjourned until tomorrow morning at nine o'clock.

The Board of Commissioners met pursuant to adjournment. There were present Commissioners Griffith and Platte and Paul R. Brooks County Clerk. The following proceedings were had.

In the matter of the petition of

vacation of a road.

The reviser having reported in favor of vacating said road the report was this day publicly read and it appearing to the satisfaction of the Board that said road has become useless and no objections being made it is ordered that so much of the Lecompton Middle road (so called) leading from Lawrence to Lecompton as lies between the following named points to wit: Beginning at a point in said road where it intersects the Sedgewick road thence to a point where said road intersects the Charles Taylor road (so called) be vacated.

The reviser having reported in favor of establishing the change of road the report was publicly read. A remonstrance against the establishment of the proposed change signed by W. H. Christian and others was presented and read, after hearing several statements for and against the proposed change it was ordered that the further consideration of the report be postponed temporarily.
