In the matter of the petition
of H. W. Thompson and others
for a county road

The viewers having reported in favor of the establishment of the road the report was this day publicly read and no legal objections being made and the board being of opinion that said road as laid out and surveyed will be of public utility It is Ordered that the road be established in part to wit: all except the first fifty five chains as surveyed, and that the report of the viewers with the survey and plat be recorded and that said road be established fifty feet in width, it is further ordered that the County clerk issue the necessary order in the name of the Board directing the proper Officers of roads to cause said road to be opened for public travel.

In the matter of the petition
of S. O. Thacher and others
for a county road

The petitioners having made application for the location and establishment of a road as follows Beginning in the road up the Kansas Bottom at the S.E. corner of the N.E. 1/4 of Section 10 Town 12 Range 19 thence West on the most practicable route to the Scham School house being the N.E. corner of the N.E. 1/4 of Section 9 in said Township and range thence West on an established road 250 rods thence North on said established road 160 rods thence West to the N.W. corner of Section 8 in said township and range thence to Excompton by the most practicable route, and S. O. Thacher one of the petitioners having filed his bond conditioned for the payment of all costs and expenses accruing on said application in case the prayer of the petitioners be not granted, which bond is accepted and approved, and it appearing that ^{said petition is signed by} at least twelve house holders of Douglas County residing in the vicinity of the proposed road and that notice of the presentation of said petition has been given as required by law it is ordered that J. A. Kelley, C. D. Hugheson and L. C. Emery be appointed viewers of said proposed road and Holland Wheeler Surveyor and that they meet on the 14 day of May 1869 at the house of Levi Baldwin and after being duly sworn proceed to the discharge of the duties of their several appointments as required by law.

The reports of the Trustees of Wakarusa and Palmyra Townships of the affairs of said Townships for the year just over were examined with the vouchers for expenditures and approved. Mr. A. O. Neill Oarsen of poor Palmyra Township presented his report of receipts and disbursements for the year ending April 1st 1869 which was examined and approved.
