

In the matter of the petition
of J. D. Wood and others
for ^{the vacation of} a county road

The petitioners having made application for the vacation of the following described road to wit: Beginning at the S.W. corner of Section 1 Town 14 Range 20 thence East one mile and J. D. Wood one of the petitioners having filed his bond in the sum of One Hundred Dollars payable to the State of Kansas for the use of the County of Douglas, conditioned for the payment of all costs and expenses accruing on said application in case the prayer of the petitioners be not granted, which bond is hereby accepted and approved, and it appearing that said petition is signed by not less than 12 householders of Douglas County, and that notice of the presentation has been given according to law it is ordered that Job Robinson W. J. Barber and C. M. Sears be and they hereby are appointed viewers and Holland Wheeler Surveyor of said road and that they meet on the 19th day of May 1869 at the Pinson School House and after being duly sworn proceed to the discharge of the duties of their several appointments according to law and it is further ordered that the County Clerk issue in the name of the Board the necessary Orders to the viewers and Surveyor and that said viewers and Surveyor report their proceedings in the premises to the Board at its next session.

In the matter of the petition
of August Wulfskuhle and
others for a county road.

The petitioners having made application for the establishment of a road as follows: Beginning at a point on the Section line dividing Sections 25 and 26 Township 12 Range 18 where the Lawrence and Topeka road angles North and East thence West on Section line as near as practicable to the N.E. corner of Section 32 Town 12 Range 18 also begin at the N.E. corner of the N.W. 1/4 of Section 31 Town 12 Range 18 thence West on Section line as near as practicable to the West line of Douglas County, also beginning at the center of Section 32 Town 12 Range 18 thence North one half mile, to intersect an East and West road. And August Wulfskuhle one of the petitioners having filed his bond in the sum of Two Hundred Dollars payable to the State of Kansas for the use of the County of Douglas, conditioned for the payment of all costs and expenses accruing on account of said application, in case the prayer of the petitioners be not granted and it appearing that not less than 12 householders of said County have signed said petition and that notice of the presentation of the petition has been given as required by law it is ordered that A. R. Leonard Tho. Pinson and John W. Lohr be and they are hereby appointed viewers and Holland Wheeler Surveyor of said road and that they meet at the house of William Draper on the first day of June 1869 and after being duly sworn proceed to the discharge of the duties of their several appointments, according to law. It is further ordered that the County Clerk issue in the name of the Board the necessary Orders to the said viewers and Surveyor and that said viewers report their proceedings in the premises to the Board at its next session.
