

In the matter of the petition
of William H. Christman
and others for a county road

The petitioners having made application for the establishment of a road as follows beginning where the present travelled road from Lawrence to Topeka strikes the north east corner of the west half of the north west quarter of section 4 town 13 range 18, running thence south one half mile, thence south upon the most practicable ground to the north east corner of section 17, (1 mile) thence east one half mile thence south 2 furlongs, thence east one half mile, thence south two furlongs, thence east and upon the most practicable ground, one mile and a half to where the present Lawrence and Secorston road strikes the center of section 14 town 13 range 18. And William H. Christman one of the petitioners having filed his bond in the sum of One hundred and fifty dollars payable to the state of Kansas for the use of the county of Douglas conditioned for the payment of all costs and expenses accruing on said petition in case the prayer of the petitioners be not granted, and it appearing that said petition is signed by at least twelve house holders of the county of Douglas and that notice of the presentation of the petition has been given as required by law, it is ordered that J. C. Jones, James Beach and Thomas Clarke be and they hereby are appointed viewers and Holland Wheeler Surveyor of said road and that said viewers and Surveyor meet at the place of beginning designated in the petition on the 9th day of August 1869 and after being duly sworn proceed to the discharge of the duties of their several appointments, according to law, it is further ordered that the county clerk, now in the name of the board the necessary order to said viewers and Surveyor.

In the matter of the petition
of Peter Hahn and others
for a county road

The petitioners having made application for the establishment of a road as follows, beginning at the south east corner of the south west quarter of section 34 township 12 range 18, thence west on section lines as near as practicable, two miles, to intersect a north and south road and Peter Hahn one of the petitioners having filed his bond in the sum of One hundred dollars payable to the state of Kansas for the use of the county of Douglas conditioned for the payment of all costs and expenses accruing upon said applications, in case the prayer of the petitioners be not granted, and it appearing that said petition is signed by at least twelve house holders of the county of Douglas and that legal notice of the presentation of said petition has been given it is ordered that William Lewis, D. D. Hill and Henry Heard be and they hereby are appointed viewers and Holland Wheeler Surveyor of said road and that said viewers and Surveyor meet at the place of beginning designated in the petition on the 8th day of September 1869 (or failing to meet on
