of Jehu Wilson and others for
the establishment of a road

The viewers having reported in favor of the establishment of said road the report was this day publicly read and no legal objections being made thereto. It is ordered that the report, plat and survey be recorded, and that said road be established. It is further ordered that the County Clerk issue an order in the name of the Board to the proper Overseers of roads directing them to cause said road to be opened according to law.

The viewers having reported in favor of the establishment of said road the report was this day publicly read, and no legal objections being made thereto, the Board being of opinion that said road as laid out and surveyed will be of public utility, it is ordered, that the report of said viewers with the survey and plat of said road, be recorded and that said road be established a public highway. It is further ordered that the County Clerk issue an order in the name of the Board to the proper Overseers of roads directing them to cause said road to be opened according to law.

In the matter of the petition of
Joseph Fager and others for the
establishment of a road

The viewers having reported in favor of the establishment of said road the report was this day publicly read, and said viewers having filed a separate report, in writing, of the amount of damages which they have awarded to several owners by reason of the location of said road through their several premises, said report was also read and the Board being of opinion that the compensation and damages awarded by said viewers to the several claimants to wit: To C. H. Looney one hundred dollars compensation, J. C. and William Barnicklow fifty dollars compensation for land is reasonable and just, but that said road is not of sufficient importance to the public to warrant the payment of said compensation and damages out of the County Treasury. It is ordered that said petition be dismissed without further proceedings.
