The viewers report having been read
at the April meeting and laid over
the report was again read and being in favor of the establishment
of the road and no legal objections being made. It is ordered that
the report of said viewers together with the plat and survey of said
road be recorded and that said road be established a public high-
way. It is further ordered that the County clerk issue an order in the
name of the board to the proper Overseers of roads directing them
to cause said road to be opened according to law. The viewers having
made a separate report in writing awarding damages as follows-
viz To Whitford Thurbles \$75. and to John L. Hoos \$75. and the
board being of opinion that said awards are reasonable and
just it is ordered that the county clerk issue an order on the
Treasurer in favor of said claimants for the amount so awarded.

In the matter of the petition of
Fredrick Hoos and others
for a road

The viewers having reported in
favor of the establishment of said
road the report was this day publicly read and being no
legal objections the board being of opinion that the road
as laid out and surveyed will be of public utility, it is
ordered that the report of said viewers together with the plat and
survey of said road be recorded, and that said road be established
a public highway. It is further ordered that the county clerk issue in
the name of the board an order to the proper Overseers of roads directing
them to open said road for public travel according to law.

The board adjourned until tomorrow morning
at nine o'clock.
