

In the matter of the petition of P. H. Derby
and others for the alteration of a county road.

The viewers having reported in favor
of the establishment of said change the report was this day publicly read
and no legal objections being made nor damages claimed, the board
being of opinion that said change of road as laid out and surveyed
will be of public utility. It is ordered that the report of the viewers
with the plat and survey of said change of road be recorded and
that said change of road be established forty (40) feet in width. It
is further ordered, that the county clerk issue an order in the name
of the board to the proper owners of roads to cause said change of
road to be opened for public travel according to law.

In the matter of the petition of J. A. Crammer
and others for the vacation of a part of
the Lawrence and Menard road

The viewers having reported
in favor of the vacation prayed for. The report having been read
at the July session and laid over, was again read and the board
being of opinion that said road is of public utility and should not
be vacated. It is ordered that said petition be dismissed without
further proceedings and that the petitioners pay the costs and expenses
that have accrued by their aforesaid application.

In the matter of the petition of Harvey Cosley
and others for the establishment of a road.

The viewers report having been
publicly read at the July session of the board and laid over until the
October session was again read and the board, after due consideration
being of opinion that said road is not required by the public conven-
ience. It is ordered that said petition be dismissed without further
proceedings and that the petitioners pay the costs of caused by
their aforesaid application.

In the matter of the petition of J. C. Vincent
and others for the establishment of a road.

The viewers having filed their
report whereby it appears that they are of opinion that said road
ought not to be established a public highway. It is ordered that said
petition be dismissed without further proceedings and that the petitioners
pay the costs and expenses that have been caused by their aforesaid
application.
