The board of county commissioners of the county of Douglas State of Kansas met pursuant to adjournment. There were present commissioners Brooks, Jones and Fleinshaw. The following proceedings were had.

In the matter of the petition of Forrest Savage and others for the vacation of a road

The petitioners having made application for the vacation of a road as follows: That a part of the road established on the petition of R. Wells and others October seventh 1870 be vacated as follows beginning at the North East corner of the North West quarter of Section Three (3) Township Thirtieth (30) Range Tenth (10) Thence vacate South one mile, to the South line of said Section Three (3) and Forrest Savage one of the petitioners having filed his bond in the sum of two hundred dollars payable to the State of Kansas for the use of the county of Douglas conditioned for the payment of all costs and expenses accruing upon said application in case the prayer of the petitioners be not granted, which bond is accepted and approved. And it appearing that said petition is signed by at least twelve householders of the county of Douglas and that notice of the presentation of the petition has been given as required by law.
