The board being satisfied that said road is no longer of public utility. It is ordered that a part of the road established upon the petition of Thomas B. Wells and others, October seventh AD 1870 be vacated, as follows viz: Beginning at the North East corner of the North West quarter of Section Nine T. 29 N. R. 30 E. Range nineteen (19) Thence South one mile, or to the South line of said Section Nine.

In the matter of the petition of J. A. Cosgrove
and others for the establishment of a road.

The views having reported in favor of the establishment of said road and no legal objection being made nor damages claimed. It is ordered that the report of the views with the plat and survey be recorded and that said road be and the same is hereby established a public highway. It is further ordered that the county clerk issue in the name of the board an order to the proper owners of roads directing them to cause said road to be opened for public travel according to law.

In the matter of the petition of J. Gleason
and others for the establishment of a ^{change of} road.

The views having reported in favor of the establishment of said change of road, and no legal objection being made nor damages claimed. It is ordered that the report of the views with the plat and survey be recorded and that said change of road be established. It is further ordered that the county clerk issue in the name of the board an order directing the proper owners of roads to cause said change of road to be opened for public travel according to law.
