

Lawrence Kansas Thursday April 6 1871

The board of commissioners of the county of Douglas met pursuant to adjournment. There were present Commissioners Brown, Jones and Keirshaw and Paul R. Brooks county clerk.

The following proceedings were had.

The reports of Henry Webb trustee of Marion township W.B. Disbrow trustee of Clinton township and Thomas McCall trustee of Willow Springs township for the past year were presented examined with vouchers and approved.

In the matter of the petition of E. G. Macy and others for the vacation of a road

The views having reported in favor of the vacation of said road and said report having been read at the October meeting 1870 and laid over for further consideration was this day again read and the board being of opinion that said road is of public utility it is ordered that the petition be dismissed at the costs of the petitioners.

In the matter of the petition of E. G. Macy and others for the alteration of a road

The views having reported in favor of the establishment of said change of road the report was this day publicly read and no objections being made nor damages claimed, the board being of opinion that said change of road as laid out and surveyed will be of public utility it is ordered that the report plat and survey be recorded and that said road be located and established. It is further ordered that the County clerk issue an order in the name of the board directing the proper officers of roads to cause said road as changed to be opened for public travel according to law.

In the matter of the petition of Bartley King and others for the alteration of a road

The views having reported in favor of the establishment of said road the report was this day publicly read and on motion ordered that the report be laid over until the 19th day of April 1871.

In the matter of the petition of Joseph Page for the vacation of a part of the town site of Palmyra

This being the day set by the board to take testimony regarding the occupancy of the land proposed to be vacated as a part of the town site and no person appearing to protest against it It is ordered that the County Clerk make in the name of the board a certificate declaring the provisions of section twenty three (23) of chapter one hundred and nine (109) of the General Statutes of Kansas duly applied to the land applied to be vacated by said Page as a part of the town site of Palmyra and that the clerk file such certificate in the office of the Register of Deeds of Douglas County

The county clerk presented to the board County warrants to the amount of \$229.40 which had remained unclaimed for a period of three years a list of which was filed in the clerk's office and the
