Monday July 10th 1871

The board of commissioners of the county of Douglas met pursuant to adjournment there were present Commissioners Groves, Jones and Henshaw and Paul R. Brooks county clerk.

The following proceedings were had.

M. S. Beach Esq. Treasurer turned over to the board warrants or orders on the Treasury paid by him to the amount of thirty eight thousand, five hundred and twenty one dollars and sixteen cents (\$38,571.16)

Ordered that the chairman of the board and county clerk be and they hereby are appointed a committee to compare the county orders turned over by the treasurer with the record of county orders raised and also to make a list of the same as required by law. It is further ordered that the county clerk be and he hereby is directed to cancel said orders on the record.

In the matter of the petition of D. H. Nail Bishop of Kansas asking that the ^{case of the} Bishop's residence be remitted

Ordered that the county attorney be and hereby is authorized and instructed to prepare a statement of the case in connection with the attorney of Bishop Nail and submit the same to the judge of the District court for his decision.

The board adjourned until tomorrow morning at nine o'clock
