

In the matter of the petition of
William Millner et al for the estab-
lishment of a road beginning at the
Section corner to Sections 8-9, 16
and 17 Township 12 Range 20

The jurors having reported
in favor of the establishment of said road the report was
this day publicly read, and no legal objections being made
nor damages claimed, the board being of opinion that said
road as laid out and surveyed will be of public utility
it is Ordered that the report of the jurors, with the plat
and survey be recorded and that said be and the same
is hereby established a public highway. It is further
Ordered that the County Clerk issue an Order in the name
of the Board to the proper Overseer or Overseers of roads di-
recting them to cause said road to be opened according
to law.

In the matter of the petition of
Charles Pilla and others for a road

The jurors having reported
in favor of the establishment of said road the report was
read. Ordered that the further consideration of the report
be postponed until November tenth ad 1871

The board adjourned until tomorrow mor-
ning at nine o'clock.
