The report of the viewers having been read at the July session of the board and laid over until the October session it was again read and the viewers having made a separate report in writing of the amount of compensation and damages awarded by them to the several land owners through whose premises said road has been located, said report was also read. And the board being of opinion that said award of damages to wit: To Charles Durr, Compensation \$60. To Eli Harris Compensation for land is reasonable and just, but that said road is not of sufficient importance to the public to warrant the payment of said compensation out of the county treasury. It is Ordered that the petition be dismissed without further proceedings and that the petitioners pay the costs and expenses that have been caused by their aforesaid applications.

In the matter of the petition of
John F. Brown and others for
a road commencing at the N.
E. Corner of Section 26 Town 14 Range 18

The viewers having reported in favor of the establishment of the road, the report was this day publicly read, and no legal objection being made nor damages claimed. The board being of opinion that said road as laid out and surveyed will be of public utility. It is Ordered that the report of the viewers with the plat and survey of said road be recorded and that said road be established. It is further Ordered that the county clerk issue an order in the name of the board to the proper Overseer or Overseers of roads directing them to cause said road to be opened for public travel.
