

Critchfield, William Brown and Joseph Savage three disinterested householders of the county of Douglas be and they are hereby appointed viewers, and T. C. Darling Surveyor of said road and that said viewers meet at the place of beginning designated in the petition on the fifteenth day of November A.D. 1871 at ten o'clock a.m. and after being duly sworn proceed to the discharge of the duties of their several appointments according to law. It is further ordered that the county clerk issue, in the name of the board the necessary Order to said viewers and Surveyor.

In the matter of the petition of L.
D. Minner and others for a road

The petitioners having made application for the establishment of a road as follows. Beginning at the South West corner of Section Seventeen (17) Town fourteen (14) range twenty one (21) Thence running West on section line to the North West corner of Section Twenty three (23) Town fourteen (14) range twenty (20). And L. D. Minner one of the petitioners having filed his bond in the sum of two hundred dollars, payable to the County of Douglas, conditioned for the payment of all costs and expenses accruing upon said application in case the prayer of the petitioners be not granted, which bond is accepted and approved. And it appearing that said petition is signed by at least three householders of the county of Douglas and that notice of the presentation of the petition has been given as required by law. It is Ordered that George Lutter, W. E. Barnes and J. N. Pans three disinterested householders of the county of Douglas be, and they are hereby appointed viewers and T. C. Darling Surveyor of said road and that said viewers and Surveyor meet at the place of beginning designated in said petition on the twenty third day of November A.D. 1871 and after being duly sworn proceed to the discharge of the duties of their several appointments according to law. It is further Ordered that the county clerk issue, in the name of the board the necessary orders to said viewers and Surveyor.
