

Tuesday January 2 1872

The board of county commissioners of the county of Douglas met pursuant to adjournment. There were present commissioners Groves, Jones and Shaw and the county clerk.

The following proceedings were had

In the matter of the petition of
J. J. McGhee and others for a road

Said petitioners having made application for the establishment of a road as follows. Beginning at the North West corner of section four, (4) township thirteen, (13) range twenty, (20) Thence South on section line as near as practicable to a point where the Lawrence and Franklin road strikes said section line, And J. J. McGhee one of the petitioners having filed his bond in the sum of two hundred dollars payable to the state of Kansas for the use of the county of Douglas conditioned for the payment of all costs and expenses accruing on said application in case the prayer of the petitioners be not granted, which bond is accepted and approved, and it appearing that said bond is signed by at least twelve householders of the county of Douglas, and that notice of the presentation of the petition has been given as required by law, It is ordered that Geo. W. Goss & Co. Longfellow and J. M. Work three disinterested householders of said county, do and they hereby are appointed viewers and locating surveyor of said road and that said viewers and surveyor meet at the place of beginning on the 27th day of January A.D. 1872 and after being duly sworn proceed to the discharge of the duties of their respective offices according to law. It is further

Ordered that the county clerk issue an order in the name of the board to said viewers and surveyor to view and survey said road and make return thereof according to law.

In the matter of the petition of Nathan Bond and others for an alteration of road.

The said petitioners having made application for the alteration of a county road as follows, that a change be made in a county road located on the South line of section twenty three (23)
