It is Ordered that S. McCallie G. Griffith and A. C. Geradit three disinterested householders of the county of Douglas be and they hereby are appointed viewers, and J. C. Darling Surveyor of said road and that said Viewers and Surveyor meet at the place of beginning designated in the petition on the 24th day of January 1872 and after being duly sworn proceed to the discharge of the duties of their several appointments according to law. It is further Ordered that the County Clerk issue in the name of the Board the necessary Orders to said Viewers and Surveyor.

In the matter of the petition of J. M. Shepherd and others for a change of road

The petitioners having made application for the alteration of a road in words as follows to wit: Some petitioners householders of said county respectfully ask that a change be made in the road leading from the town of Bloomington to the bridge on the Wakarusa known as Hutchinson's bridge to wit: Beginning in said road, at a point about forty rods east of the West line of the farm of N. L. Rice and thence in a South East course on the most practicable ground to the South end of the approach to said bridge. and J. M. Shepherd one of the petitioners having filed his bond in the sum of Three hundred dollars payable to the state of Kansas for the use of the county of Douglas, conditioned for the payment of all costs and expenses accruing upon said application in case the prayer of the petitioners be not granted, which bond is accepted and approved. And it appearing that said petition is signed by at least twelve householders of the county of Douglas and that notice of the presentation of the petition has been given as required by law.
