The petitioners having made application for the vacation of a part of the road established April 6th ad 1871, on the petition of S. A. Walderman and others as follows Beginning where said road intersects the Lawrence and Emporia road three South to the South West corner of Section three (3) Township fourteen (14) Range eighteen (18) and J. M. Shively one of the petitioners having filed his bond in the sum of Five hundred dollars, payable to the State of Kansas, for the use of the County of Douglas conditioned for the payment of all costs and expenses accruing upon said application, in case the prayer of the petitioners be not granted, which bond is accepted and approved, and it appearing that said bond is signed by at least twelve householders of the County of Douglas and that notice of the presentation of the petition has been made and published according to law. It is Ordered that William Brass, Aaron E. Platts and A. A. Farrow three disinterested householders of the County of Douglas be and they are hereby appointed Reivers and T. C. Darling Surveyor, and that said Reivers and Surveyor must at the place of beginning designated in said petition on the third day of May 1872 and after being duly sworn proceed to the discharge of the duties of their several appointments, according to law. It is further Ordered that the County Clerk issue in the name of the Board the Necessary Orders to said Reivers and Surveyor.
