The board of commissioners of the county of Douglas, Kansas met thisward to adjournment. There were present commissioners Darling, Grover and Distrow and Paul R. Brock, County Clerk.

The following proceedings were had.

A petition was presented signed by C. O. Gause and others asking for the establishment of an additional voting precinct in the township of Eudora. Ordered that the petition be not granted.

In the matter of the petition of E. Salwell and others for the return and reestablishment of a road

The said petitioners having made application for the review of a county road established in the year 1859 in words and figures as follows to wit: Whereas there was a road established in the year 1859 commencing at the Twin Mounds and Topeka road at the south west corner of the south west quarter of Section Thirty-six (36) Township Thirteen (13) range Seventeen (17), running thence North on or near the section line between Sections 35, 36, 25, 26, 23, 24, 13, 14, 11 and 12 to connect with a road from Big Springs at the S.W. 1/4 of Section one (1) of said township and range in Douglas county and State of Kansas therefore we the petitioners respectfully request the Honorable board of commissioners of Douglas county, to reestablish said road because of the destruction of the record of said road at the Quantrill raid and it appearing to the satisfaction of the board that the true course of said road has become uncertain.
