The review having reported
in favor of the establishment of said road, the report was
this day publicly read, and said review having filed
a separate report in writing in relation to compensations
and damage said report was also read. A remonstrance
against the establishment of said road signed by Charlotte
A. Frayer and twenty two others was presented and read. The
board after hearing several parties for and against the
establishment of the road Ordered that the reports be laid
over until the July session of the board 1873.

In the matter of the petition of
G. L. Nyckoff and others for the
vacation of a county road.

The review having filed
a report the report was read. A remonstrance
signed by Alfred Deppo and others was presented and
read. Ordered that the report be laid over until the
July session of the board.

In the matter of the petition
of Thomas E. Evans and others
for the establishment of a road

The report of the review
having been read at the January session and laid
over until the April session was again read, and being
favorable to the establishment of the road no objections
being made nor damages claimed the board being of
opinion that said road as laid out and surveyed will
be of public utility, It is ordered that the reports of the
review with the plat and survey be recorded and that
said road be established. It is further Ordered that
the county clerk issue, in the name of the board an
Order to the proper Overseers of roads directing them to
cause said road to be opened according to law.
