It is Ordered that Braam Hinshaw, A. J. Jennings and T. B. Smith three disinterested house holders of said county, be and they are hereby appointed viewers, and T. C. Darling Surveyor of said road and that said viewers and surveyor meet at the place of beginning designated in said petition on the sixth day of May A.D. 1873 at ten o'clock a.m. and after being duly sworn proceed to the discharge of the duties of their several appointments. It is further Ordered that the county clerk issue in the name of the Board, the necessary Orders to said viewers and surveyor

Ordered that the contract for doing the county printing and advertising for one year from the first day of May 1873 be and the same is hereby awarded to F. D. Thacher at the same rates and terms and on the same conditions as the contract now in force
